Three Free AI Games - Crossword, Jeopardy and Bingo

One list of family inside jokes, three free games: the crossword, Jeopardy! board and bingo card that beat every phone

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Twenty family facts, like nicknames, old addresses and that one story nobody lets go of, are all AI needs to write the clues. Free sites turn them into printable games in about 15 minutes flat, no cost, no login.

🤖 **WOW!** Phones come out at every family party by 3 p.m. The cure is one list of 20 family facts that AI turns into a crossword where 12-Across is “What Uncle Dave backed the car into in 2009),” a *Jeopardy!* board and a bingo card. Total build time: 15 minutes. Total cost: zero.

The Short Version: Feed 20 family facts to AI for the funny stuff, then paste the info into free builders. Steps below.

I’ve seen it. Maybe you have, too. The big family gathering has the same arc: hugs, food, then everyone’s face down on a phone.

Here’s the fix, and it costs nothing. One list, three games. Jot down about 20 family facts: nicknames, the street where Grandma grew up, Dad’s first car, the casserole nobody admits to hating. Birthday party? Load the list with the guest of honor.

That list is your ammunition. AI is the comedy writer. The free sites below are the engineers.

Game 1: The crossword

Paste your list into **ChatGPT**, **Claude** or **Gemini** with this:

Turn these family facts into crossword clues. Format each as ANSWER: clue. Make them funny but solvable by someone who knows us. Answers must be single words or short phrases with no spaces.

Then go to crosswordlabs.com, paste your pairs, and it snaps together a printable puzzle in seconds. No account needed. Don't ask AI to build the grid itself. It's brilliant at clues and terrible at making words cross. (I've watched it happen. It's rough.) Print a stack, scatter pencils, stand back.

Game 2: Family Jeopardy!

Same list, new prompt:

Turn these facts into a "Jeopardy!" board. Five categories, five clues each, easy at the top, brutal at the bottom, phrased as answers the players respond to with questions.

Think "Uncle Dave's Greatest Hits" and "Casseroles of Mystery."

Build it free at jeopardylabs.com, then cast it to the TV. Hand hosting duties to the relative who thinks they're Ken Jennings. There's always one.

Game 3: My pick, party bingo

A 5×5 card of common occurrences at your gatherings. Prompt:

Write 24 funny bingo squares of things that always happen at our family parties.

"Someone retells the car story" is the free square, obviously. Paste them into myfreebingocards.com, print a stack and play to blackout.

Three pro moves: Print one crossword answer key and guard it like a state secret. Ask AI for an easier kids' version of everything. And put a \$10 gift card on the line. That turns game night into a blood sport. (The fun kind.)

Total cost: a prize card for the winner and one printer cartridge. Total payoff: three generations at one table, arguing about 12-Across.
